

MDA – a very short history I



1st Revolution

from navigation and 'routes', to control over 'zones'

Knowing as a geopolitical tool Power projection

"The dominance of Her Majesty's navy was due in no small part to collaboration between the British Admiralty, the maritime community, and the scientific elite. Together, they transformed the vast emptiness of the ocean into an ordered and bounded grid."




2nd Revolution

3rd Revolution

Surveillance & detecting anomalies
Data fusion, algorithms
Intelligence led law enforcement

Securitized tool for tackling transnational threats (pirates, smugglers, terrorists)

Global MDA architectures

- Traffic monitoring and global Search and Rescue provision (IMO)
- Fisheries monitoring (FAO and NGOs)
- An emerging global maritime security network?
- → Regional example (WIO)

Conclusion: What hinders MDA?

- Complexity and overlap of architectures
- (Hidden) geopolitical interests
- Lack of trust between agencies (domestic, bilateral, multilateral) as well as between states
- Technological fantasies instead of pragmatic low tech attitude
